#### 1. USTTAD - Upgrading the Skills and Training in Traditional Arts Crafts for Development

##### BACKGROUND

**Upgrading the Skills and Training in Traditional Arts/Crafts for Development (USTTAD)** scheme aims at capacity building and updating the traditional skills of master craftsmen/artisans. These trained master craftsmen/artisan will train the minority youths in various specific traditional arts/crafts.

Traditional Arts and Crafts is a strongest link with the culture heritage of our nation. Embroidery is one of the most popular craft practice in India. It is practice in with beautiful variation in different style of stitches. Design in Indian Embroidery is formed on the basis of the texture and the design of the fabric and the stitch. The dot and the circle, the square, the triangle and permutations and combination of these constitute the design.





## OBJECTIVES OF THE TRAINING :

- To build capacity of master craftsmen/artisans and training of young generation through the master craftsmen/ artisans for traditional arts/crafts.
- Set up standards of identified arts/ crafts and their documentation.
- To establish linkages of traditional skills with the global market.
- To improve employability of existing workers, school dropouts etc.
- To generate means of better livelihood for marginalized minorities and bring them in the mainstream.
- To enable minorities to avail opportunities in the growing market.
- To ensure dignity of labour.
- Design development and Research in traditional arts/crafts.

The project was implemented in the Mukalmuwa Block, Nalbari District, State – Assam.

300 nos of beneficiaries were trained on Hand Embroidery along with computer and behavioural skills, life skills.

## KEY OBJECTIVES OF ORGANISING THE SEMINAR :

- To provide insights into factors that enhance vulnerability to being targeted as a “WITCH”, causes that trigger such accusations and underlying factors that enable them, it also throws light on the different types of violation that constitute victimization, its long- term consequences for the victim.
- To Provide understanding of WITCH hunting in particular contexts, to identify structural, systemic and individual factors that trigger and enable such victimization.
- To develop an understanding of WITCH hunting based on data drawn from studies and police records and to recommend an action plan for prevention, justice and accountability for WITCH hunting and indeed for similar form of victimization regardless of the motive.
- Creating awareness on equal access to education for women & girls with special measure to eliminate discrimination, universalise education, eradicate illiteracy, create a gender-sensitive educational system, increasing enrolment and retention rates of girls and improve the quality of education to facilitate lifelong learning as well as development of occupation/vocation/technical skills by women.
